This new month also brings the month of the Rosary. This might be something to consider as part of your spiritual life for this month, perhaps as you take your walks along the beach! We also gather for the Rosary on Zoom each Saturday morning at 9.30am.

Speaking of walking, thanks to those who continue to help with our letterbox drop – we do have a bit of a way to go. We have distributed 5000 cards to date, but we still have a few areas to cover. This coming week we commence a series of short video clips from the musicians of the Mission to use for prayer and reflection. Each Monday on the Facebook page and the website you can see a short clip of sacred music performed in one of our churches, to use as a short time of reflection. On Wednesday week, we will screen another night of Praise and Worship, from Kevin and Shireen, two of our talented parishioners from Nazareth parish.

This coming Wednesday we also begin a discussion around the Brisbane Archdiocese series, 'More With Jesus', based on some podcast reflections. More details are in the bulletin this week and details of the zoom link. This small Bayside group will enable us to share and reflect on our faith during these lockdown times. There are plenty of things to keep us engaged during the week: 'The Chosen'; 'Refueled- MenAlive'; 'More with Jesus'; weekly Saturday Rosary and Sunday Mass and the weekly sacred music clips. Scripture Reflection

In today's Gospel, the Pharisees try to trap Jesus with a trick question. The "lawfulness" of divorce in Israel was never an issue. Moses had long ago allowed it (see Deuteronomy 24:1-4). But Jesus points His enemies back before Moses, to "the beginning," interpreting the text we hear in today's First Reading.

Divorce violates the order of creation, He says. Moses permitted it only as a concession to the people's "hardness of heart"—their inability to live by God's covenant Law. But Jesus comes to fulfill the Law, to reveal its true meaning and purpose, and to give people the grace to keep God's commands.

Marriage, He reveals, is a sacrament, a divine, life-giving sign. Through the union of husband and wife, God intended to bestow His blessings on the human family—making it fruitful, multiplying it until it filled the earth (see Genesis 1:28).

That's why today's Gospel moves so easily from a debate about marriage to Jesus' blessing of children. Children are blessings the Father bestows on couples who walk in His ways, as we sing in today's Psalm.

Marriage also is a sign of God's new covenant. As today's Epistle hints, Jesus is the new Adam—made a little lower than the angels, born of a human family (see Romans 5:14; Psalm 8:5-7). The Church is the new Eve, the "woman" born of Christ's pierced side as He hung in the sleep of death on the Cross (see John 19:34; Revelation 12:1-17).

Through the union of Christ and the Church as "one flesh," God's plan for the world is fulfilled (see Ephesians 5:21–32). Eve was "mother of all the living" (see Genesis 3:20). And in Baptism, we are made sons and daughters of the Church, children of the Father, heirs of the eternal glory He intended for the human family in the beginning. The challenge for us is to live as children of the kingdom, growing up ever more faithful in our love and devotion to the ways of Christ and the teachings of His Church.

A VOCATION VIEW

The Christian Vocation has expression through marriage, single life, priesthood and consecrated life. Our call to holiness is to answer God's call to build the Kingdom of God. 'Let the little children come to me; ... for it is to such as these that the Kingdom of God belongs.'

St Francis of Assisi- Feast Day 4th October

St Francis of Assisi (1182–1226) is a much loved saint who inspires us today. As a young man he led a worldly, carefree life. Imprisoned and ill after a battle between Assisi and Perugia, he underwent a conversion of heart and devoted himself to care of the poor, outcasts and lepers. He received a call from God to possess nothing but to do good everywhere. He began preaching and gathered twelve disciples around him who became the original brothers of his order, the Franciscans. Working alongside him Clare of Assisi founded the Poor Clares.

It has been said that Francis represents an alter Christus, that he was truly a living icon of Christ. He has also been called "the brother of Jesus". Indeed, this was his ideal: to be like Jesus, to contemplate Christ in the Gospel, to love him intensely and to imitate his virtues. In particular, he wished to ascribe interior and exterior poverty with a fundamental value, which he also taught to his spiritual sons. The first Beatitude of the Sermon on the Mount "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 5: 3) found a luminous fulfilment in the life and words of St Francis. Truly, dear friends, the saints are

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the best interpreters of the Bible. As they incarnate the word of God in their own lives, they make it more captivating than ever, so that it really speaks to us. The witness of Francis, who loved poverty as a means to follow Christ with dedication and total freedom, continues to be for us too an invitation to cultivate interior poverty in order to grow in our trust of God, also by adopting a sober lifestyle and a detachment from material goods. - (Pope Benedict XVI, 2010)

Enrolments for 2021 have now closed. Information on the 2022 program will be available soon.


Our volunteers have been out and about enjoying the spring weather, getting some exercise and spreading our pastoral outreach cards.


