Sacrament of Reconciliation / Confessions

Following the slight easing of restrictions, there is an allowance for a small gathering of no more than five people outside a Place of Worship. The 'guidelines' state:

Religious Gatherings: Can also take place outdoors with five people plus a faith leader. Must be adjacent to the place of worship with only one group permitted at a time. You can only travel up to 5km from your home to attend a gathering and only for 2 hours.

Within the constraints of these guidelines, we are now able to offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation outdoors, with some social distancing and face masks.

Confessions will be available this Saturday morning outside Stella Maris church, Beaumaris from 10-11am.

To comply with government rules, there is only allowed to be a maximum of five people waiting at any time in the designated space. If there are five people waiting, please remain in your car, or at a distance. Please also remember to wear a face mask and observe social distancing.

November – Month of the Holy Souls

On Sunday week we begin the month of November, when Catholics traditionally remember those who have passed before us. During this month, I invite you to pray for those in your communities who have passed away during this year, and particularly in the past months during the restrictions.

One way of recalling our loved ones is to have a picture of them in a prominent place this month, perhaps with a candle, and to gather as a household to pray together briefly each day.

As Catholics, we have the custom of 'November Masses', offering Mass for those family and friends who have died and for all the faithful departed. It is a great act of charity to pray for the dead, and to recall those who have nobody to pray for them. The Mass is the greatest prayer that we have.

At the moment, we are unable to have November envelopes or a 'Book of the Dead' in our churches to write in. Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord,

Let's continue to pray for the fair and equitable opening of our churches very soon, in line with other places in our communities. We have been encouraged to contact our local government MP's about this. The comments of the Archbishop in the media this past week were very encouraging about making our voice heard to be treated equally. Let us pray for justice in this regard. We need to be able to gather together as a community of faith in our places of worship, safely. When this is deprived of us, we all suffer.
